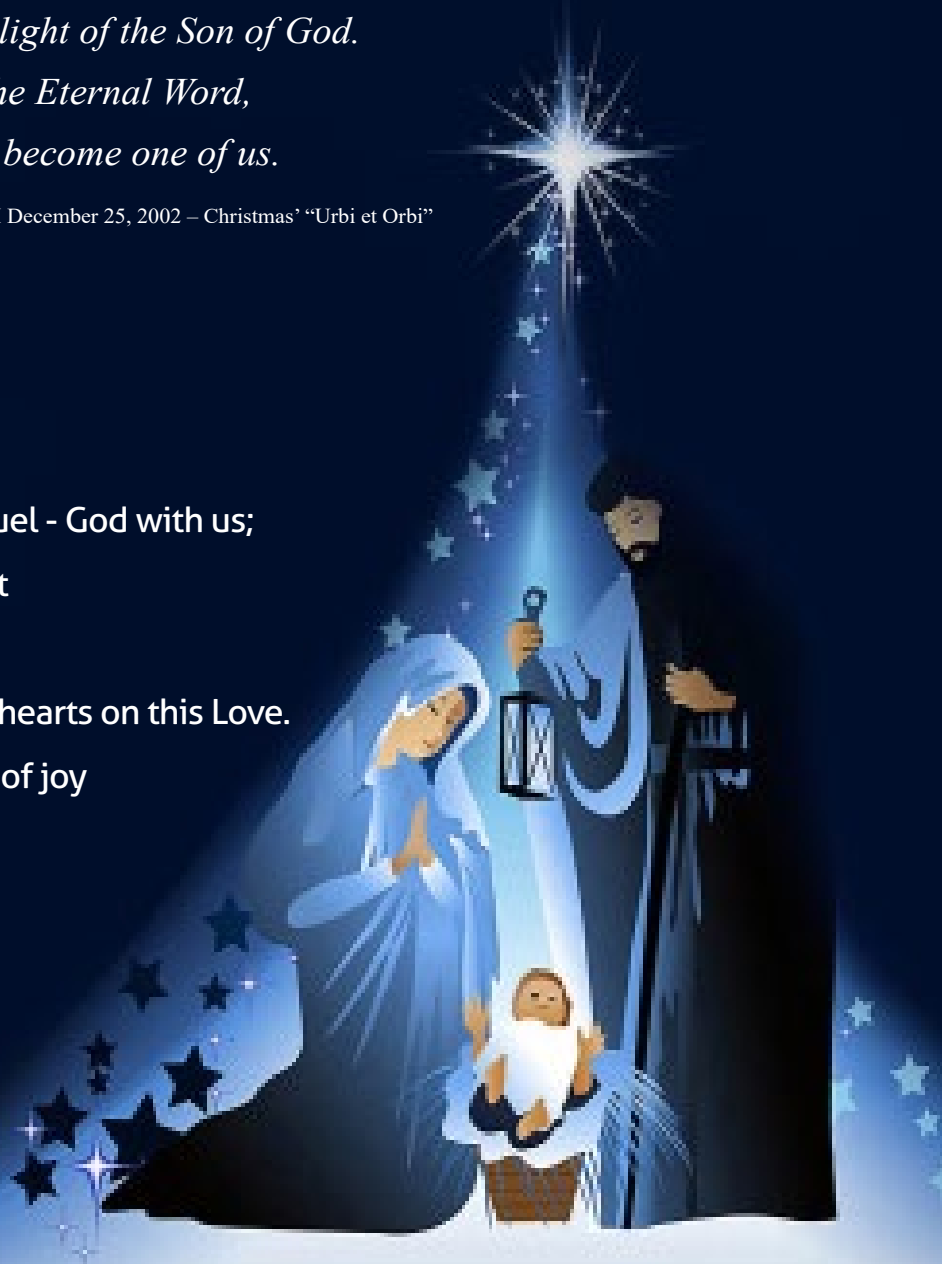

# Archbishop Szczepan Wesoly (1926-2018)

On August 28, 2018, Archbishop Szczepan Wesoly died in Rome in the age of 92, in the 62nd as a priest and in the 50th year as a bishop. The priestly ministry as an Archbishop was associated with Rome, where in 1956 he was ordained a priest. After the ordination to the presbyterate, he worked in Rome at the Polish publishing houses connected with the jubilee of the millennium of the baptism of Poland. He also worked, among others as head of the Slavic Press Section Office during the Second Vatican Council. From 1967, he was the head of the Central Immigration Pastoral Center in Rome. In 1968 he became the auxiliary bishop of the Archdiocese of Gniezno. In 2003 he retired, then served at the St. Stanislaus Polish church in Rome, where until 2007 he was the rector.

For many years he was the Chairman of the Administrative Council of the John Paul II Foundation, and promulgated the teachings and legacy of John Paul II to all John Paul Foundation Chapters. On October 13, 1994, Archbishop Szczepan Wesoly, as the Chairman of the Administrative Council of the John Paul II Foundation, opened and blessed our House in Lublin.

For his pastoral work, he was awarded many times: Order of the White Eagle, Doctor Honoris Causa of the John Paul II Catholic University of Lublin and the University of Silesia, the Great Cross of the Renaissance, the Golden Laurel of



Polonia and Lux Ex Silesia.

The funeral ceremony of the Archbishop was held on September 10 this year in Katowice. It was started by the Eucharist, celebrated at the Cathedral of Christ the King in Katowice, under the leadership of Archbishop Wojciech Polak, Primate of Poland. The homily was delivered by His Excellency Wiktor Skworc, Archbishop of the Diocese of Katowice. At the beginning of the Mass was read the letter from the Holy See, which emphasized the merits of the Archbishop for the universal and local Church. It was also reminded that late Archbishop Szczepan was a close associate of the Holy Father John Paul II.

„The deceased shepherd is still on the way, soil had as much as his foot covered it, but through his ministry so many places on Earth received the message

from God, transformed into eternity.

At the time of his death, Archbishop Szczepan rolled up his tent, ended the nomad's life as a shepherd, entered a new reality, into a new world that we trust is his promised land, homeland and home” - Archbishop Skworc said in his sermon.

At the end of the Eucharist, a condolence letter from the President of the Republic of Poland Andrzej Duda was read out. „Thanks to the efforts of Archbishop Szczepan Wesoly fellow citizens abroad could feel a true community and experience unity. As living in exile, gave us an example of love for the

Fatherland „- wrote the President. The following speakers also took part in the cathedral: Marcin Krupa, the president of Katowice and Archbishop Stanisław Gądecki, chairman of the Conference of Bishops.

Archbishop, according to his will, was buried in the crypt of bishops in the church of Saint Apostles Peter and Paul in Katowice. Many believers, priests, bishops and people of the consecrated life participated in the funeral Eucharist. Obviously, there could not have been missing members of the John Paul II Foundation who came from Italy, Germany, France, Great Britain and Poland to say goodbye to the Person, who had done so much to the John Paul II Foundation.

May He rest in peace!

## Second Ann. of death of Maciej Bednarkiewicz



November 11th marks the second anniversary of Mr. Maciej Bednarkiewicz's passing. Mr. Bednarkiewicz, lawyer, was a long-standing member of the Administra-

tive Council of the John Paul II Foundation in Rome and co-initiator of the John Paul II Foundation Warsaw Chapter. For many years, his wife, Ewa Bednarkiewicz serves as the President of the Chapter.

Maciej Bednarkiewicz was born in 1940 in Warsaw. He was studying law at the Warsaw University. Since 1969, he had his own law firm. He was a teacher for many generations of lawyers and one of the most famous lawyers in Poland, an excellent expert of the law. In 80th, he was cooperating with the Primate's Committee for Aid to People Deprived of Freedom

and their Families. He was the advocate in many political lawsuits as well as the attorney-in-fact for Barbara Sadowska, mother of Grzegorz Przymyk. Merited in faith for free and just Poland and endlessly involved in the wellbeing of the John Paul II Foundation, especially in the scholarship program existing in Lublin. A man of a deep faith and extremely devoted to his family. In the free Poland, he was an MP for the 10th parliament from the Citizens' Committee (1989-1991). He was also the head of the State Tribunal in years 1991-1993 and 1997-2001. From 1989 to



1995, he was the head of the Supreme Bar Council and later a member of the Polish Bar Authorities. He served also as the chairman of the supervisory board of Bank

Millennium. In 2004, he became a member of the program council of the Civic Platform. Since 2002, he was a member of the advisory board of the Press Freedom Monitoring Center of the Polish Journalist Association. He received the Great Badge of the Meritorious Advocate and was honored with the Commander's Cross of the Order of the Rebirth of Poland by Lech Kaczyński.

On October 23, 2018, Archbishop of Lublin Stanisław Budzik blessed the monument at the Maciej Bednarkiewicz tomb located in Warsaw's Powiązki. The tomb of Maciej Bednarkiewicz is located in the

first alley of the Old Powiązki. The monument was created by the famous sculptor Prof. Wincenty Kućma, who also created, among others, the Warsaw Uprising Monument located at the Krasiński Square. The monument depicts hands ready to help, two hands above the cross. It is a symbol of my husband's work. On the top there is an excerpt from the Psalm 85, which is stating that Loyalty will spring up from the earth, and Justice will often down from heaven. My husband often stated that sentence – said Ewa Bednarkiewicz, wife of Mr. Bendarkiewicz in the interview with KAI.

## Meeting of the presidents of the Foudation John Paul II

On April 20-21, 2018 in Rome took place the meeting of the presidents of the John Paul II Foundation Chapters spread all over the world. It was a wonderful time filled with joint prayer, formation meeting, as well as sightseeing of the Eternal City and the summer residence of the Popes in Castel Gandolfo. The meeting also allowed to exchange experience and to take an insight into the future of the Foundation. The first day started with a Mass celebrated at the tomb of the Foundation's founder, St. John Paul II. The Mass was celebrated by His Excellency Archbishop Konrad Krajewski, Papal Almoner and formerly longtime Papal Ceremonial. Fr. dr. Krzysztof Wieliczko, Administrator of the John Paul II Foundation, who was the organizer of the entire meeting, delivered the homily during the Mass. In his homily, he pointed out the truth about holiness, he said: "The truth about the John Paul II holiness in a special way shone after his departure to the Father's House. That truth encourages us to look for our personal holiness. The holiness is not gained only in the extraordinary situation, but in the way of personal vocation and service, in the daily carrying out our duties. We should have in mind the John Paul II words: "Saints do not demand applause from us, but that we will imitate them." What the holiness of this extraordinary Pope is teaching us? First of all – that we should courageously profess our faith."

Then, presidents of the Foundation Chapters gathered in the language groups to share their experiences in their own local Chapters, spoke about their successes and difficulties. In the second part of the meeting, spoke the alumni and current fellowship recipients of the John Paul II



Foundation program. Once again, their testimonies made the participants aware how important and beautiful is the work of the John Paul II Foundation.

The second day started with a solemn Mass at the Chapel of the Miraculous Image of Salus Populi Romani in the Basilica of Santa Maria Maggiore which was celebrated by his Eminence Cardinal Stanisław Ryłko, Archpriest of the Basilica of Santa Maria Maggiore and the President of the Administrative Council of the John Paul II Foundation. Cardinal Stanisław Ryłko in his homily said: "John Paul II as his apostolic motto chose these famous words: "Totus Tuus!" that is "All Yours, Mary"! It was his program according to which he organized his entire life, as a young man, as a cleric of the underground seminary in Krakow, as a bishop and as a

Pope. In them encloses the secret of his spiritual power, which to this day inspires great admiration: more than 100 apostolic pilgrimages, 15 encyclical, approximately 3,000 speeches and catechesis made in so many languages. The great Apostle and teacher of faith! Once John Paul II himself revealed a piece of his Marian devotion secret and explained the meaning of "Totus Tuus" by saying: "This formula has not only the nature of the devotional saying, it is not only an expression of devotion, but it is more..." (Crossing the Threshold of Hope, p. 157) so in these words was included his entire life program!...

Then, the Holy Father in memory went through the most important meetings with Mary – from the image of Our Lady of Perpetual Help in Wadowice's parish, through the tradition of the Carmelite's



scapular at the Carmelite Fathers Church in Wadowice's Gorka, through the Sanctuary of Kalwaria Zebrzydowska, to Jasna Gora (Czestochowa). This was the school of His Marian devotion, which resulted in the "Totus Tuus!" - "All Yours, Mary"

Directing our sight of faith in the direction of this ancient Icon of the Mother of God "Salus Populi Romani" let us say again after St. John Paul II "Totus Tuus!" - "All Yours, Mary"

After the Mass, Cardinal Ryłko personally met with the participants of the Mass and talked about the history and architecture of the Basilica. Then participants of the meeting went for the sightseeing of ancient Rome. Some of them refreshed their memory, but most of the participants were able to see the ancient Rome for the first

time. In the afternoon, another meeting in the adequate language groups was held. This meeting was devoted to reflections and plans for the future in achieving the objectives of the Foundation. The day ended with the movies related to John Paul II "Apartment" and "Nine Days that Changed the World."

Sunday, was the day of the visit to the Gardens and the Pontifical Palace at Castel Gandolfo, the place which has many memorabilia of the Founder of the Foundation, now Saint John Paul II. In the early afternoon, in the Papal Church in Castel Gandolfo, a Mass was celebrated by His Excellency Rev. Józef Staniszewski, Bishop of Grodno, alumni of the John Paul II Foundation, who in his homily stated: "Brothers and sisters. Great Pope, Saint John

Paul II, god shepherd, asked the gathered people and all people of good will to open wide the doors to Christ – human hearts and borders of countries. Precisely he, following the example of the Good Shepherd, took on his shoulders a man in need, made sure that the candle with a weak flame will not be quenched, led to the green valley so we could rest, explained the Scriptures, gave a helping hand, helped to immerse submerge into the Church's heritage, exactly to those who needed it, so they would not be able to say that: I do not have a man to help me.

All of this has become possible and effective, thanks to your, dear Brothers and Sisters, generosity and kindness. Today, on behalf of all who felt the "touch of the passing Lord", from the bottom of our hearts we say 'thank you.' We put our prayers, through the intercession of Saint John Paul II, in front of the God's throne and we ask the Good Shepherd to continue to touch virtuous hearts of daughters and sons of the Church to be able to make a "gift of self" for others. We ask Saint John Paul II, from the window of the House of the Father, to bless all, bless members of the great mission - the John Paul II Foundation. May the Blessed Virgin Mary, who heard, adopted and lived the Word of God, always guard you and accompany you in your mission path."

Strengthened with Word of God, joint prayers, work, and joyful celebrations, Presidents of the Chapters ended their visit in Rome with the meeting with Cardinal Ryłko in the gardens of the Polish Home.

## 40th anniversary of St. JP II election to the Peter's See



On the occasion of the 40th anniversary of St. John Paul II election to the Peter's See, the John Paul II Foundation in cooperation with the Museum of the Family Home of JPII in Wadowice organized a concert "I was looking for you." The concert took place in the Santo Spirito Church in Sassia in Rome. Verbal parts of the concert were used from the St. John Paul II Testament while the music was composed by Bartosz Tomaszek. The concert featured famous artists from Krakow: Patrycja and Jacek Kotlarski, as well as Pola Tomaszek. Numerous people attended the concert among whom were many distinguished guests such as Stanisław Cardinal Ryłko and Mrs. Anna Kotańska, wife of the Polish Ambassador to the Holy See.



On the following day, Sunday, October 21, 2018 at 8:15 a.m. a solemn Mass was celebrated by the relics of St. John Paul II in the St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. The Mass was celebrated by Stanisław Cardinal Ryłko who also delivered the homily: Saint John Paul II: The Pope of great prayer and great acts ....

Despite passing years, the person of St. John Paul II is still fascinating people. Many new publications related to the Pope were and are published. A few years ago, one of the Italian journalists wrote a book with a meaningful title "The Pope who does not die" John Paul II lives in the hearts of many people and in their memories...Numerous pilgrims who on the daily basis are kneeling in a deep prayers by the relics of the Saint Pope provide the greatest testimony to my statement.. We can say that by the altar with his relics there is one in a kind, never ending Papal audience. "The Pope who does not die" this is one of the most characteristic virtue of all saints: they are alive... Upon their return the House of the Father, they become more present for us than when they were alive... Often returns the basic question: in fact, who was St. John Paul II for the Church, for the world, for Poland and for each of us...It is impossible to pass by John Paul II without any feelings... we constantly feel some kind of an inside hunger, a feeling that we still don't know him well enough... Then, who was St. John Paul II? Most of all, John Paul II is a person of an unbreakable faith ...Homo

Dei God's man...a man of a great prayer and contemplation, entirely submerged in God...When he was praying, when he was celebrating a Mass he was going into another God's dimension. And we were able to feel it! Many people converted seeing him celebrating a Mass; deeply submerged in a prayer...John Paul II is also a man of great acts, tireless pilgrim of Evangel who crisscrossed all continents. "Open wide the doors for Christ (... ) Do not be afraid. Christ knows „what is in man”" This was the main program of his long spiritual service which was ongoing for 27 years... he did not spare himself... He knew how to be entirely for God and entirely for people...He had 104 apostolic pilgrims to 135 countries... he delivered over 3,000 speeches... his pilgrims were ongoing for one and a half million kilometers ... Millions of people were able to see him personally and were able to listen to his words stated in their native languages... he is the author of 14 encyclicals and 14 Apostolic Exhortations. He himself called 15 Synods of Bishops... John Pau II that is a Good Samaritan who with love leaned over painful wounds of modern people...He became the voice of those who did not have it. Thanks to him, Europe was able to breath with both lungs – Eastern and Western. John Paul II is a genuine prophet of our times: with courage he was demanding respect for human rights, but also and most of all for a place for God in the world...As any prophet, for many

people John Paul II was problematic as he was not afraid to say the truth...thus, in the memorable year 1981, at the St. Peter's Square he was shot ... John Paul II is also the Pope who led the world into the third millennium.. This is the Pope who was marked with the cross of illness and old age. He was not ashamed and was going through this with dignity... visible to the entire world. He was faithful to his mission as the successor of St. Peter till the end... and finally: John Paul II is a great Apostle of Divine Mercy...Proclamation of God who is reach in mercy was the leading line of his Pontificate...It was not a coincidence that he went to the House of the Father in the eve of the Divine Mercy Sunday in the year 2005. And, his beatification and canonization took place exactly on the Divine Mercy Sunday. It was him, who in the year 2002, in the Divine Mercy Sanctuary in Łagiewniki entrusted the entire world to Divine Mercy. The words stated at that time, today, when the world is experiencing a deep crisis, have a special meaning. With a voice which at the time already was losing its strength he said: "God, merciful Father (... ) we entrust to you today the destiny of the world and of every man and woman. Bend down to us sinners, heal our weakness, conquer all evil, and grant that all the peoples of the earth may experience your mercy. In You, the Triune God may they ever find the source of hope. Eternal Father, by the Passion and Resurrection of your Son, have mercy on us and upon the whole world!..."





## Guests from Indonesia – Welome! Selamat datang!



On Saturday, July 7th, 2018 at the John Paul II Foundation Home in Lublin we hosted our Friends and Benefactors from Indonesia; the Chapter President Lucia Liando and Rina Ciputra Sastrawinata. Father Krzysztof Wieliczko OSPPE, Administrator of the Foundation in Vatican accompanied them. More than 50 people gathered in our auditorium including participants of the preparatory and qualifying course, fellowship recipients, and alumni.

## Fr. Krzysztof Wieliczko in Ireland

The Irish Chapter of the St. John Paul II Foundation were honoured to have Fr. Krzysztof Wieliczko, executive director of the JPII Foundation, visit us from the 31st August to the 2nd September. We prayed and visited sites dedicated to our Lady.

Our Lady Island is on the South East Coast of Ireland in Co. Wexford. It is an ancient place of peace and pilgrimage, every year thousands of people visit to make their pilgrimage, especially during the time from the 15th of August till the 8th of September, when the closing Mass is followed by torchlight procession around the Island. We visited there on the morning of Friday 31st August where we prayed the Rosary and the Divine Mercy around the Island.

On Friday evening we gathered at St. Aidan's Adoration Chapel in Ferns Co. Wexford where we had our Holy Hour which included the Rosary, (The Mysteries of Light). Each mystery we prayed through the writings and encyclicals of St. John Paul II. We prayed how Christ is the centre of Creation and History and He redeemed all Mankind. The Holy Spirit is

Remembering the words of St. John Paul II, „the Saints do not ask for applause” but to be imitators”. Mass concluded with a great crowd gathering for refreshments and chat. Our gratitude as always to Fr. Billy Swan for his



dedication and presence for our Chapter celebrations each month. To the Sisters of Adoration for their very warm welcome each month to celebrate the Mass in their Chapel and their love and hospitality. We are very grateful.

On Saturday 1st September Fr. Krzysztof joined with Fr. Billy to celebrate mass in St Aidans Cathedral in Enniscorthy, Co. Wexford. This is the home of our Bishop of the Ferns Diocese, Rev. Bishop Denis Brennan. Again Fr. Krzysztof was very warmly welcomed, following Holy Mass we travelled to Knock in Co. Mayo.

St. John Paul visited this Holy Shrine in 1979 when he visited Ireland, to mark the centenary of the apparitions. The mass was attended by 450,000 people. He lit a candle at the gable wall where Our Blessed Mother, St. Joseph, St. John the Evangelist, and the Lamb and the Cross appeared. Fifteen people from the ages of 5 to 74 witnessed the apparitions. It rained for 2 hours on that August 21st evening at around 8 pm while the people prayed the Rosary. Many miraculous cures have been reported and today it is the oasis of healing, reconciliation and peace for many thousands of people. Pope Francis visited this Holy Shrine on the 24th August this year and presented a Golden Rosary, again emphasising the great need for devotion to Our Blessed Mother Mary and to the wonderful prayer of healing the "Rosary".

As the sun shone brightly on this Beautiful shrine, we spend some time in prayer at the Apparition Chapel where Our Blessed Mother Mary had appeared.

We prayed the Rosary and listened to the



beautiful hymn dedicated to Our Lady of Knock. A group of young men spoke with great honesty and courage their prayers of petition and thanksgiving to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament and to their Mother Mary Virgin and Queen.

On Sunday the 2nd of September Fr. Krzysztof was given a very warm welcome to Ireland and to Knock and celebrated Holy Mass in the Parish Church with the Parish Priest and visiting priests.

## 45th of the Priestly Ordination of Prelate Stefan Wylęzek

The John Paul II Foundation Great Britain Chapter last Sunday that is April 8, 2018

celebrated the 45th anniversary of the priestly ordination of the Rector of the Po-

lish Catholic Mission (PCM) in England and Wales, Monsignor Stefan Wylęzek. The president of the JPII Chapter, Ewa Szymańska merged this beautiful jubilee with the traditional "Easter Egg."

At noon, a solemn Mass was celebrated at the St. Andrew Bobola Church in London. The person celebrating the jubilee, Monsignor Stefan Wylęzek accompanied by the Chancellor of the PCM Rev. dr. Krzysztof Tyliczszak, SChr was celebrating the Mass. The Mass was requested by the President, Board and Members of the JPII Foundation Chapter in Great Britain in the intention of health, God's blessings and necessary graces for the Monsignor Stefan Wylęzek on the occasion of the 45th anniversary of the priestly ordination. The Vicar of the Church, Rev. Maciej Michałek delivered the sermon in which he spoke about mercy as it was the first Sunday after the resurrection of Christ, thus Divine





Mercy Sunday. Referring to the Gospel, he was saying that we should be merciful and act in accordance to the Gospel. Then, at the end of the Mass Chancellor Krzysztof Tyliczszak, SChr in beautiful words expressed gratitude for the Prelate's 8 years-long service among us, for his care and prayers. He also recalled some facts from the life of the Rector, saying about his achievements in Rome, where for 25 years he was serving as the Administrator of the JPII Foundation and director of the Polish Institute of the Christian Culture. At the very end, after the Rosary, we were able to pay homage to the relics of St. John Paul II and St. Faustina.

The second part of the meeting, which attracted approximately 100 people, took place in the Polish Social & Cultural Association (POSK), in the „Łowiczanka” restaurant. The John Paul II Foundation, starting in the year 1990 the scholarship program began a wonderful, great deed, not only it provides to the young generation ability to obtain a good education and spiritual growth, but also during the twenty years of this Foundation's function, it experiences new shaping in the spirit of love, mutual support and solidarity. I believe, that this deed should exist and be reinforced as it touches fate of many young people, shows the directions of their development and it provides a testimony of the Christian values. It is a lot to say about the relations and people who throughout their personal life were showing what it means to be a Christian. They did not spare their efforts and they gave their entire hearts to young people, who are looking for their responsibilities and would like to shape the world in peace and love. Also, I would like to express over here my gratitude to the Director of the Foundation's Home at that time, Fr. Ryszard Krupa, with whom I went through the wonderful years of my studies in Lublin

and who, as a father and as a friend, was accompanying me at that time. All that experience brought fruits as upon my return to my homeland I started to pass this to the new generation in my own country. As a dean, I decided to undertake a task of creating this Sulkhvan-Saba Orbeliani's Catholic University. From this prospective, we can draw a conclusion that the Foundation's input in creation of this University in Georgia was significant. I would like to express my gratitude to the John Paul II Foundation and a wish of God's blessing for all upcoming years.
